According to CMS...



THE final rule is meant to ensure that Medicaid's home and community-based services programs in residential and non-residential settings provide full access to the benefits of community living and offer services in the most integrated settings. The rule mainly contains criteria that relate to residential settings, however there will be additional guidance on how the rule impacts non-residential providers, such as adult day centers. There is even a greater focus for programs to be integrated in and have access to the greater community. People should have more opportunities to seek employment and work in competitive integrated settings.

NCDSNB continues to make improvements to our service delivery system focusing on choice and community access. Additional crews working in the community have been added and continue to grow.
